MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR



Happy New Year!

Hopefully this first 2026 Reporter reaches you and your family having a happy, healthy, and prosperous New Year. Things around the City have going nonstop! Below is your update on what's been going on and what's coming next.

Castle Hills Police and the Castle Hills Police Officers Association

The Police Department has been on a busy streak, and that's putting it lightly. The Criminal Investigations Department has been leading several high-profile cases, some of which you might have seen come across your local news. On occasion some residents have asked why Castle Hills Police are working cases outside of Castle Hills. The answer is simple, if Castle Hills is working a case, it is more than likely related to crime that was committed in Castle Hills. In many instances, the Officers will find the bad actor in various parts of the San Antonio Metroplex, in which case they will go and make an arrest. In some instances, these bad actors have prior charges and, in these situations we will collaborate with different agencies where those offenses may have occurred.

This multiagency collaboration is extremely helpful. Aside from working together and comparing notes, it can also mean more access to law enforcement resources. Like much of Castle Hills, our Police Department runs on a very lean budget and doesn't have some of the extra tools that can be helpful. When we collaborate, that means that different agencies will bring those tools that make our Officers more efficient and most importantly safer. An example of these tools is having K9's that can either detect drugs or find people, drones that can safely view areas of danger, and even helicopters that safely track bad actors.

A "secret" benefit is that the Castle Hills team creates working relationships with these other agencies and they can learn from one another. Recently we recognized two Texas Rangers for their collaboration with CHPD. These Rangers were extremely grateful that Castle Hills shared in their in the commitment to apprehending criminals. One went as far as thanking the Castle Hills City Council for supporting the Castle Hills Police Department. Of course we do!



While Castle Hills Police has been doing their share of law enforcement work, it is heartwarming to see them go above and beyond by giving back to the community. In December they partnered with Blue Shield Law Enforcement Motorcycle Club and Balcones Heights Police Officer Association to give gifts to those in need. This is the 2nd year that they have partnered. Blue Shield showed up with a big presence and large amounts of presents! The children loved to see the motorcycles, meet the Officers, and they really loved the gifts!

Infrastructure Update

We are in the final stretch for our Carolwood and Manton projects. It is with great pride to share that we completed the overall scope of the project by the projected completion date of December 2025. There is small work left over as we did have some delays that pushed the schedule back, but the delays had minimal impact to major portion of the project. This largely includes the detention pond across Lockhill Selma and some punch list items in front of your homes. There are final details to be ironed out, to include making sure that we get everyone's property back to normal. Please reach out to the City Manager or myself if you have pending issues. We are working to make sure that we can address all issues before the final payment is made to the contractor.

Thank you to everyone for your patience and grace as we tackled these projects. Both Carolwood and Manton had been projects that had been long delayed due to flooding

There appears to be trench failure that has caused quite the divot between Antonian and Aggie Park. We are working with City Engineers to come up with a plan to address this issue.

With all of the new roads, we will need to start focusing on maintaining our investments. In driving around, there are a lot of streets that can benefit from crack seal. Of course we can't forget our alley's, that are in need of attention as well.

Next big event on the horizon is Castle Hills Fiesta but there will certainly be some events in between. Thank you for your continued support. Please let us know if there is anything we can do to make your life better in Castle Hills.

MESSAGE FROM THE CITY MANAGER By Chris Duque, City Manager

HAPPY NEW YEAR!

One of the City's greatest efforts for 2026 will be communication with the community. The City has an active presence on social media; on Facebook, please like and follow the City's various pages: "City of Castle Hills," "Castle Hills Police Department," and "Castle Hills Fire Department;" and the City of Castle Hills also has an Instagram page. Constant information is posted regarding programs, projects, notices, etc. The City also utilizes a free notification system called "RAVE." RAVE provides alerts regarding City services, events, emergencies, etc.; once registered, individuals will receive emails or text messages. During a disaster, such as a winter storm, flood event, tornados, etc., the City would rely on RAVE notifications as its primary notification tool. For incidents such as planned SAWS service cutoffs for repairs/upgrades or scheduled electrical service interruptions by CPS for maintenance or upgrades, RAVE would also be the primary notification tool. We urge residents and businesses to register for this free notification tool; register using the following link: https://www.smart911.com/smart911/ref/reg.action?pa=castlehillscity. On YouTube, the "City of Castle Hills Texas" page includes videos of City meetings including city council, zoning commission, crime control and prevention, parks and project commission, and board of adjustment.

In keeping with the greater communication goal, the City plans to host an OPEN HOUSE event later this year. The Open House event would be a meet and greet with City staff members and

the community to include question and answer sessions with City leadership, department heads, and other employees.


Many great activities are planned for this year. On July 14th, the City of Castle Hills celebrates its 75th "birthday;" the City was incorporated on July 14, 1951. An event recognizing the City's 75th anniversary is being discussed and planned.

The City is in the planning phase of the 2026 street work. The fiscal year 2025-2026 budget included an allocation of \$555,000 for street work with planned work on Sunflower Ln – Lockhill Selma to NW Military, Moss Dr – Lockhill Selma to NW Military, and Krameria Dr – Lemonwood to Caladium. Unfortunately, the deteriorating condition of West Avenue near Ranchland Dr necessitated reprioritizing the planned street work; this section of West Ave is the priority with the other street segments becoming alternate projects based on available funding. Due to the proximity of the road work to the Antonian College Preparatory High School, it is necessary to postpone the repair work until the summer after the school year ends. City crews will place asphalt as a temporary measure to level out the road.

City offices will be closed on Monday, January 19th in observance of Martin Luther King Jr. and on Monday, February 16th in observance of Presidents' Day. During the weeks of these holidays, the solid waste schedule will be adjusted.

## Friends and Neighbors,

I trust that your new year has gotten off to a great start. The Joyces enjoyed a lovely holiday season, with our older son Patrick in town as well as having the opportunity to spend the new year with family at the coast. We are truly blessed. Also most enjoyable was the holiday luncheon with city staff. It was generously provided by the good folks at Castle Hills Christian Church, and we offer our thanks to their entire community.

The first topic I would like to bring you up to date on is the grant from the Alamo Area Metropolitan Planning Association (AAMPO). They have awarded us \$110,000 to hire a consultant to develop a pedestrian and bike plan for Castle Hills. City Manager Duque and I have met with the AAMPO team and are close to having the Request for Proposals completed. Once underway, the project will be managed by AAMPO with input from us and should take about a year to complete. This is a wonderful thing for our City, as it goes a long way toward supporting the Comprehensive Plan's advocacy of pedestrian and bike paths in Castle Hills. One of the project's critical tasks will be to suggest possible funding sources for the implementation of the plan. We expect one of the benefits will be a safe connection to Hardberger Park, where we can tie into San Antonio's extensive trail system.

Meanwhile, the CHCO Art Committee is making great progress in adding seven sculptures to the Commons. You may have already noticed that concrete pedestals for the support of the sculptures have been constructed. Castle Hills resident and artist Bill Fitzgibbons has given very generously of his time to develop a plan for this great addition to our City. There will be a contest among Texas sculptors for the right to place their sculpture on the pedestals for the first year. The contest will be curated by the Curator of Modern and Contemporary Art at the San Antonio Museum of Art. After a year on display, Castle Hills residents will have the opportunity to vote on their favorite sculpture. The City will purchase the winning sculpture, and the process will be repeated for another six years, at which time the sculpture garden will be complete. It is our hope that the garden will provide a sense of delight and admiration for our residents and visitors. It is anticipated that private funds will assist with the costs of the project.

# Is Clover Beneficial to Lawns?



Surprisingly, the lucky clover is often considered merely a common lawn weed to be killed. In fact, until recently, it was standard practice to include clover seed in lawn seed mixes; it was valued as a built-in fertilizer since it can fix atmospheric nitrogen in the soil.<sup>5</sup> Clover snatches nitrogen out of the air, bringing this essential fertilizer down to earth using its nitrogen-fixing bacteria that lives in nodes along the roots.

A clover lawn provides a low-maintenance landscaping solution to many environmental concerns about grass lawns. Beneficial clover can also accomplish the following for your lawn:

**Reduces excessive irrigation:** Clover tolerates drought conditions better than grass because it has long roots that enable it to access water at deeper levels.

**Looks better longer:** It has a lasting green color and stands up better to heavy foot traffic than grass.

**Improves tough soil:** Clover tolerates compacted soil better than lawn grass, and its long tap roots also help to aerate your soil.

**Minimizes pollution:** Clover lawns reduce the pollution caused by herbicides, pesticides, and chemical fertilizers. In addition, because they usually don't need to be mowed as often as grass lawns, there's less pollution caused by lawnmower

emissions.<sup>6</sup> Agriculture and Air Quality. United States Environmental Protection Agency.

**Attracts pollinators:** Clover puts out a mildly attractive flower that draws bees and other pollinators to your landscape.

**The origin of four-leaf clovers** bringing good luck stems from ancient Celtic, or Druid, priests. They elevated the rarer four-leaf clovers to the status of good luck charms.

### Facts and Myths About Four-Leaf Clover

**Fact:** Each clover leaf represents faith, hope, luck, and love.

**Myth:** Eve plucked a four-leaf clover and carried it with her out of the Garden of Eden.

**Fact:** The term "luck of the Irish" is related to four-leaf clovers growing abundantly in Ireland.

**Myth:** Children in the Middle Ages thought carrying a four-leaf clover with them would allow them to see fairies.

**Fact:** The four-leaf clover genes can also produce more leaves, although that is even rarer. According to Guinness World Records, the most leaves on a clover stem (*Trifolium repens* L.) is 56, discovered in Japan in 2009.<sup>2</sup>

**Myth:** Legend has it, Napoleon dodged a fatal bullet (literally) because he bent over to peek at a four-leaf clover.

**NEW YEAR OF PROGRESS AT THE  
CASTLE HILLS POLICE DEPARTMENT**

As we begin the new year, the Castle Hills Police Department is continuing its focus on professionalism, preparedness, and service to the Castle Hills community. Over the past several months, the department has been working to modernize operations, strengthen leadership, and invest in both personnel and community-focused programs.

Several key leadership updates are underway. A Patrol Services Captain has been promoted to oversee day-to-day patrol operations, and a Dispatch Supervisor has been selected to strengthen emergency communications. In the coming weeks, the department will also welcome a new Support Services Captain, a position dedicated to training, professional standards, and administrative oversight—allowing the patrol section of CHPD to remain focused on community service.

To improve clarity and accountability, the department has reclassified its administrative support role to a Support Services Coordinator, providing more clearly defined responsibilities and improved internal efficiency. At the same time, Castle Hills



Winter will be reaching our area eventually this year and when it does, we will all be doing our best to stay warm. Unfortunately, this also increases the number of fire incidents and injuries. As fire risks increase in winter, it's essential to take proactive steps to prevent emergencies before they happen.

When the temperatures get colder, some of you may try to use portable space heaters to keep warm. These units take special care to use properly and safely. It is important to keep portable heaters at least 3.5 to 4 feet away from flammable materials such as curtains, furniture, and blankets. Always turn off heaters before leaving a room or going to sleep and never use them to dry clothes. Proper use of heaters is essential to reduce the risk of house fires in winter. Candles are also a cause of many fire incidents during this time of year. Avoid using candles near flammable materials and always place them in sturdy holders. Unattended candles are a common cause of winter fire hazards. An overlooked winter fire safety tip is replacing open flames with safer lighting and heating alternatives. Furthermore, ensure gas heaters and stoves are well ventilated and regularly serviced. Stay warm safely this winter by layering clothing instead of relying entirely on heating appliances, which can cause fire hazards if misused. Avoid makeshift fires or braziers, as they pose serious risks including burns, carbon monoxide poisoning, and accidental winter fires. Practicing safe heating and carbon monoxide safety is essential to protect your home and family during the cold season.

Lastly, know your emergency exits, evacuation routes, and assembly points. Fire emergency preparedness is key to winter fire safety, so stay calm, follow your evacuation plan, and dial 911 to report any fire hazards or incidents without delay. Simple

PD is in the process of updating all policies and procedures, laying the groundwork for eventual pursuit of law enforcement accreditation through TPCA (Texas Police Chiefs Association). The department is also enhancing transparency and accountability by ensuring that each officer is issued their own body-worn camera and charging equipment, replacing the prior practice of shared devices. This improvement supports consistent documentation, officer safety, and public trust.

In addition, we've completed modest facility improvements, including interior painting and an ADA-compliant access ramp, to improve safety, accessibility, and functionality for officers, visitors, and individuals in our care.

Castle Hills PD is also implementing a child safety identification program using the KidPrint ID system, updating training and leadership development programs, and continuing to strengthen partnerships with the community. We are also implementing our annual Castle Hills Safety Fest, which will be a partnership with the Castle Hills Fire Department, our community, and other area public safety providers.

These efforts reflect a long-term commitment to continuous improvement, transparency, and responsible stewardship of city resources. We look forward to sharing updates throughout the year and continuing to work alongside residents to keep Castle Hills a safe and welcoming community.


